
Dear family and friends,



First Pres Christmas Outreach



We are able to help many people with groceries and other needs at this time of year, and the need is great, so we are able to do this on almost a daily basis.

In addition, we were able to help two families with Christmas gifts and needs through your Christmas gift contributions in the amount of \$400 each.

One family is a single mom with 3 children living at home. The two older children are teens are going to school and working to help out, the third is an 8 year old with autistic and other medical problems. Mom has MS, and had been working until her condition made it too difficult to do so. She will soon be wheelchair bound. The roof is leaking, and so the financial help we were able to provide was a great blessing to this family.

The other family is a 43 year old man with bladder cancer. He had been homeless, but friends found him an apartment. Several churches and other have helped him with deposit, getting his electric bill going and other needs while he awaits his disability checks to begin.

We also were able to make a donation to the new Homeless Shelter on Moore Street in South Boston in the amount of \$200.

Thanks to all who helped with this project to help others in time of need. The spirit of Christmas was certainly demonstrated and felt by these families, and the homeless shelter. We found out the “homeless” shelter is not as much a homeless shelter as it is a place to get people off the streets, some education to help them get a job, and get them the help they need to start having a productive life, and provide them with self satisfaction and additional skills which will help the community.


