

Greetings from the Carter family. Thank you for your support to us over the past few years and your prayers for us. We look forward to seeing you soon.







## Happy Father's Day

As we approach Father's Day, my thoughts have been directed toward some of the great men of the bible. Our Father's as it were, who came before us, and led us to where we are today.

One of those prophets my mind was lead to, was Noah. For "Noah found grace in the eyes of the Lord; for Noah was a just man...and walked with God." But "the earth was corrupt before God and it was filled with violence." We read in Matthew 24:37-39 that the days preceding the return of Christ will resemble those during the days of Noah. Noah was diligent in crying repentance to the children of men, however, they would not listen. I read a quote by Spencer W. Kimball: "As yet there was no evidence of rain and flood. ... [Noah's] warnings were considered irrational. ... How foolish to build an ark on dry ground with the sun shining and life moving forward as usual! But time ran out...The floods came. The disobedient...were drowned." I fear we are becoming more like the people of Noah's day.

How similar are we today? What great faith! He had to listen to the Lord, and react even when friends and neighbors, perhaps even normal reason could have worked to make him believe the thoughts were not real.

Yet believe and listen, he did! What faith!

Abraham was a great example of a great man. He loved the people so much, and even before he was blessed with a son, God knew he could trust him to do what was asked. Abraham asked the Lord to spare the city of Sodom if He (God) could find just 50 people who were righteous. In realizing how wicked they were, he boldly asked God if he would spare the city for even 10 people. The Lord agreed, and Abraham was happy and went his way. Unfortunately not even 10 people in the entire city could be found, so they were destroyed.

He was a loving, caring father, who was asked to sacrifice his only son, whom he loved dearly. He did so willingly and without hesitation. Only after drawing his knife to slay Isaac, did the Lord intervene.

Even with all the examples throughout scriptures, the world seems determined to follow the same path that lead to destruction. This country was founded on God, and the doctrines of the Bible, to live and follow God. We can make a difference. I think of Jonah as well, who was told the city would be destroyed if they didn't repent. He obeyed God and went about preaching and these people listened. A mighty change came about, and they repented and the Lord spared the city. Many times we may think we can't make a difference because we are just one person. But Jonah was one person, but the big difference is he had the Lord behind him. If we follow the Lord's commands He will be there with us to help see us through the struggles and challenges.

It is my prayer that as we look towards Father's Day, that we give thanks for the many father's of the scriptures and heed their word to turn to heaven, God and His son, Jesus Christ and become a mighty strong nation again. May we be more like the city of Nineveh rather than Sodom. ~ *Sherolyn*
