


Soon after the Church purchased the North Property, Grimm and Parker (Jim Slaff) was employed to develop a master plan for the use of all First Presbyterian property. In addition to a fellowship hall, a picnic shelter and sports fields, a columbarium was proposed to be sited in the northeast corner of the North Property. The master plan also recommended a Veterans Memorial to be located in the grass area near the existing seating area and fountain at the South entrance.

A small committee began developing plan for the columbarium in early 2017 but quickly realized that there were many detractors to locating it on the proposed North Property site. Additionally, the Session approved moving the playground from the South side of the Church to the North Property to co-locate family outdoor activities. Movement of the playground opened an area close the Church upon which to construct the columbarium and the Veterans Memorial - thus, the Session approved a Memorial Garden.

After nearly 18 month of pretty intense work we are pleased to announce that the Memorial Garden will be completed in time for our dedication service on 11 November - Veterans Day. The gray-granite columbarium offers 30 niches, in which either one or two remains of Church members can be interned. Additionally, as you walk to the right, there is an open Bible monument and a cross monument, each designed to contain the cremated remains of two persons and as you approach the walkway from the columbarium area to the Veterans Memorial there is another cross monument and a Bible monument. Inside the columbarium area there are also four granite benches which can be engraved to memorialize family members. The wrought iron features can also memorialize our members.

The black-granite Veterans Memorial provides colored medallions recognizing each of our military services and our POW/MIAs and a striking pose of a military person rendering a salute in memory of our fallen heroes. The Memorial is engraved to recognize all First Presbyterian veterans and others who have defended our nation and the standards upon which it was founded.



We are thankful for the excellent work accomplished by Major Construction, South Boston Memorials, Anderson Landscaping and members of our congregation.

Please plan to attend and get a close-up look at this vibrant part of our ministry outside our local world.



Pig Pickin' In November



Operation Christmas Child – Deadline November 11

Once again this thanks and giving season we are promoting the Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes. These boxes provide not only gifts and needed personal and school supplies for children around the world, but are also a beacon of God's caring for those who need to know His love.

The following story from Teresa Lee makes this ministry very real for those of us on the giving end:

"For many years I have packed shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child and have always wondered where my boxes would go and how God would use them in the life of the children who receive them. In 2016, while serving in Cameroon, I had the opportunity to attend three Operation Christmas Child gift distributions in three different locations near where I live in Yaoundé.

"The distribution programs included singing, praying, a time of discussing who Jesus was and why he died for us, an invitation to the older children to attend a discipleship class, the revealing of the special gift boxes, a time of talking about why these gifts were packed and who packed them, and then the distribution of the boxes by gender and age.

"During the distribution I had the chance to share about packing boxes and how I packed my boxes with love and prayed for the child who would receive them. My favorite part was being able to help hand out the boxes to the children. Their smiles and excitement were contagious. It is amazing to see God at work through Operation Christmas Child."

Watch for the specially printed boxes in the lobby and the foyers, and pick up one or more to fill with special items. You decide if you will shop for a boy or a girl, and what age category, ages 2-4, 5-9, or 10-14.

Return the box(es) to the church by November 11 at the latest, and we will get them to a local collection center. Our goal is 50 boxes.

Suggestions for things to include in your box are a "Wow" item, personal care items, clothing and accessories, crafts and activities, and toys. You might also want to include a personal note. For more specific gift suggestions, go to www.samaritanspurse.org.


Please do not include candy; toothpaste; gum; used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives, or military figures; chocolate or food; seeds; fruit rolls or other fruit snacks; drink mixes (powdered or liquid); liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; or aerosol cans.

Each box should also include a \$9 donation. This not only goes toward transportation costs, but helps train and equip local churches in how to share the Good News of the Lord Jesus Christ in a child-friendly way. Your donation also provides The Greatest Gift Gospel Booklets, which are written in the children's language and distributed along with shoebox gifts.


Most importantly, pray for the child who will receive your gift.
