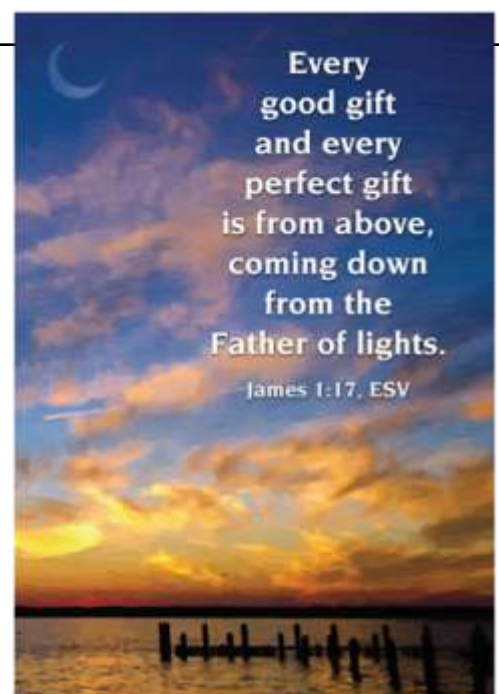

**Our Mission**—We help asylum-seekers and refugees survive and recover from forced displacement in Lille, France. In addition, we connect to other church communities in the region to build networks and raise awareness.

**Centre Update**—Currently the Lille team is renting a small room as a temporary ministry space. In March 2018, the leader of the “France pour Christ” church plant in Lille contacted us to contribute funding toward the purchase of a church building. In return, IAFR will use space in the building as a ministry centre for

asylum seekers and refugees. IAFR’s refugee work in Lille will be benefited in many ways by expanding its ministry into the church facility. It connects the team directly to a local church and it brings the cultural and administrative expertise needed for such a large project.

**Financial Commitment**—Our goal is to raise \$15,000 for the initial start of the centre. Thanks to our generous donors, as of summer, 2018, we have received \$9,219.00.



Renovation Project

We have agreed to contribute approx. \$12,000 toward the renovation cost of the building in exchange, we will be able to use the building during the week for ministry activities. Any remaining funds will be used for specific set-up costs that IAFR will have in the centre. To reach our goal we still need approximately \$6650. ~ Paul Sydnor

**Next Steps**—September thru December—help with basic renovation steps to make the building useable (new floor, roof, entrance doors, wiring, plumbing, heating, interior rooms). January - Begin ministry activities.

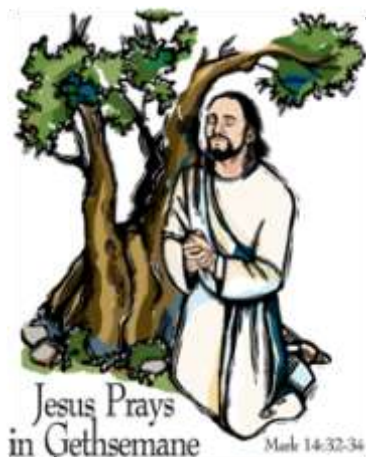

## Repent Ye and be Perfected

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We are commanded to be “perfect even as (our) Father which is in heaven is perfect” Matthew 5:48. We are commanded to keep the commandments. In Isaiah 1:16 we are told to “cease to do evil”. Most of us can say we are “perfect” in keeping some commandments (ie: not killing, stealing, etc); but if we are honest with ourselves, how many really keep all 10 commandments all the time? Keeping the Sabbath day holy, and completely for the Lord, isn’t something I’ve perfected. So, this brings me to my main topic for this month. As I mentioned last month, faith is the first principle of the gospel. So now we’ll discuss the second, which is repentance. Since we are told in the scriptures that “no unclean thing may enter into the kingdom of God”, we would have a problem if it were not for the gift of repentance. God gave us this gift to help us through our life. Since we all sin and become unclean, it is only through repentance that we can be cleansed and purified and perfected to meet the requirement of heaven. Christ says in Matt. 4:17 “Repent: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand”. We are also told: “By this ye may know if a man repenteth of his sins-behold, he will confess them and forsake them.”

Repentance is such a vital part of life as a Christian. It’s hard to separate faith and repentance, because we need faith to have a desire to repent, and to trust we will be forgiven. We need to repent to grow in faith, spirituality, and most important to return to our Father in Heaven; since we cannot enter into the Kingdom of Heaven if we are wicked. As we come before the Lord with broken hearts and contrite spirits for the wrongs we have done, Christ’s atonement pays the price, and we are made pure and clean. But without repentance His atonement would be for naught. The Lord knew we couldn’t completely follow Christ’s example and be perfect, we sin every day, but as we repent we are forgiven over and over again. In the dictionary we learn that repentance is changing and turning our hearts to the will of God. I find peace knowing as Lynn G Robbins said “Repentance isn’t His (God’s) backup plan in the event we might fail. Repentance *is* His plan, knowing that we will.” What a marvelous promise we find in the scriptures “Behold he who has repented of his sins, the same is forgiven, and I, the Lord, remember them no more.” Because the Lord loves us He is “long-suffering” and will continue to forgive us, as we repent with real intent to change. ~ *Sherolyn*

Some patients come in, perhaps after an accident or other reasons, where they have to have clothes cut off and/or destroyed, and sometimes these people do not have family that can bring them clothes to wear.
