

Though I have much to say to you about all your Elders are accomplishing, I will only address what I understand to be your primary concerns at this time.

The Transition Team and the Pastor Nominating Committee are working diligently and making progress toward finding our Interim Pastor and our full-time pastor. Please keep these searches in your prayers.

In April your Session voted to suspend worship services through June 17, to reassess at the June 18 Session meeting. Though we did not amend that decision in our May 18 meeting, a committee has been created to prepare for resumption of services as soon as possible. Many of you are anxious to return to church but may not be aware of the guidelines with which we must comply. The guidelines in Virginia for Phase 1 can be found online. I encourage you to read them; it may help you to understand our delay in opening and the efforts by the committee in preparation.

Thank you all who have sent your tithes and offerings to God's glory in our church. As our church moves forward in many ways, we hope you will continue to share your gifts.

We realize each of you are unique in your emotions and opinions at this time. Know that your Elders are always available to you and are praying for you. Most importantly, know that God is always with you. READ Matthew 6:25-34.


Highly Esteemed

Wait on the Lord

During this health crisis and pandemic, I find myself relating to several stories in scripture. I see areas I can improve. I am a bit impatient for things to change, and I can think of past experiences when I had a shortage of patience. I am trying to think more of Job and his undying faith and patience as he waited on the Lord. He had friends forsake him believing the Lord was punishing him, he lost his home, health, livelihood, "Job sinned not, nor charged God foolishly" (Job 1:21-22). Then I think of Christ and His ultimate endurance of patience and long suffering. He allowed others to spit on, and torture Him. In the garden of Gethsemane, He prayed "If thou be willing, remove this cup..., [but] not my will, but thine be done" (Luke 22:42). In His agony on the cross, he cried out "My God, why has thou forsaken me?" (Matthew 27:46). He knew He was sent here not to condemn the world, but through Him, save it (John 3:17). We also read: "For I came down from heaven, not to do mine own will, but the will of him who sent me" (John 6:38).

I am grateful for my faith and knowledge of God and Jesus Christ, His Son, who has descended below all things, and knows how to comfort me.

I heard a story of someone who had been wronged. She was struggling with feelings of bitterness, and mentally said "Someone should pay for this wrong". When she heard a voice say "Someone already has". That is profound, and really hit me. How true!

Christ is the source of all hope.

How many of us too, have felt that we have been forgotten and wondered either in heart or out loud "Where art thou?" In Psalms 27:14 we read that we are commanded to "wait upon the Lord". We need to have patience for His timetable to be fulfilled. We are to trust Him and understand that the trials and tribulations we go through are for our good and experience. I am learning to find comfort in the scriptures and realize that even if "the winds prevail against me, or the jaws of hell open its mouth wide around [me], that these things are for [my] good and experience" for Jesus Christ experienced awful trials and nothing I go through can surpass what He went through for me. Even during these hard times, we can find patience and hope in turning to our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. He is with us, and will comfort and support us in our hour(s) of need.

May I be more mindful of these facts, and be more trusting, and patient through my trials.




