

Fire at Night - A recent article in the regional newspaper reported that there are over 50,000 requests for subsidized apartments in Lille. The shortage of housing affects the asylum seekers as well. Many of those we work with sleep on a friend's floor or live outside in their own shelters.

One morning, last week an asylum seeker phoned to say that there was a fire that night in the makeshift camp of about forty asylum seekers

where I have been bringing assistance.

I immediately went to see the situation and survey the need. Four huts had caught fire and were destroyed –most likely due to fires for heating. Eight people had lost everything including their phones, clothes and documents. One man showed me his scorched hair and the wound on his head. He had been woken by the fire and escaped just in time. (See the two photos to right.)



I returned that night with eight heavy blankets. The camp is in the unlighted area behind me in the photo. Several groups of asylum seekers huddled around their small campfires. I did my best to find those affected and left several of the blankets with their neighbors.

As I spoke with different people, one man walked up to me and said, **"No one can separate me from the one who created me."** He repeated it in broken English as if to make sure I understood. I assured him I did.

That fire at night was surely another story in his long journey of displacement. It reminded me again that a person who is displaced by force has lost everything except for their story. The man's statement reminds me that these stories and events are like a refining fire for the image of God in their life.

The stories and events that forcibly displaced people go through are often traumatic. They are ground zero for finding or strengthening the connection back to God.



Trauma Healing Group - This past month, I joined with another mission worker in the area to lead a small group of asylum seekers in a trauma healing group. Two of those in our group were in the camp that night when the fire broke out.

Traumatic events like these often get pushed down or minimized in the face of what appear to be greater needs such as finding shelter, documents and jobs. The photo shows our group meeting for the last time [during] week [of

Dec. 18].

I thank God for these initial steps and I pray that ones in our group might invite their friends and help to lead another group.

Future Ministry- The photo on the right shows a team of volunteers and residents working with us to deliver food in the camp two weeks ago.

Tomorrow we are helping a small church to deliver gifts in the camp.

As the new year begins, please pray with us to find housing solutions for asylum seekers and for the ongoing ministry efforts.

We thank God for keeping us and this work safe in the past year.

We thank you for your prayers and support that have covered us and met all our needs.


New Worship Time - The Session has approved the return to 11 O'clock worship time beginning January 3. Sunday School for all will begin at 10:00 am.

I was listening to a story a woman was telling about her little boy. He had grabbed the can of Hershey's cocoa out of the cupboard and was excitedly opening it. With a huge smile on his face, he put a spoonful of the powder in his mouth. A look of confusion was the next expression. He turned the container around to check to see if it was chocolate then attempted to swallow the mouthful of powder. He was disappointed. He had anticipated a wonderful mouthful of a yummy morsel. He didn't realize that the taste he was expecting begins with a bitter powder, only after sugar is added does the confection become the delicious taste, he was hoping to enjoy.

This story makes me think about how life is full of misperceptions. Especially as the new year approaches, I can get excited to make new resolutions. To aim to improve myself with new and better habits. But often I find I have made too many new goals. I read of a person who said it this way, "I get so excited about the New Year and New Year's resolutions that I pile goals on as I would pile food onto my plate in an all-you-can-eat buffet. Just as that approach to dinner leads to pressure on my stomach, this approach to goal setting leads to pressure on my spirit. If I pile my aspirations too high, eventually they will topple."

Yes, we are commanded to "be perfect" throughout the scriptures. But we cannot do it in one day, one month or year. Becoming perfect is a lifelong process. I know I can get overanxious to change, to be closer to Christ, to be a better person. We can "let [our] heart ... be perfect with the Lord" (1 Kings 8:61) as we strive each day to be better, gradually.

Luckily, the Lord does not expect us to be perfect today. What He cares about is our daily progress and where we are at the end of our lives compared to where we were at the beginning. We may all stumble and fall, perhaps our lives are a bit like a roller-coaster, I know mine has been. But if we end on a high note, we will be ok. My goal is to remember to "continue in patience until ye are perfected". If we will "Love God with all [our] might, mind and strength, then ... *by his grace ye may be perfect in Christ.*" May we not be disappointed with life as it frequently appears to be like the chocolate powder, but with Christ's help to add the sugar we can find the sweetness in life even through all the bitterness around. With His help we can see with the proper perspective.



Session Notes: **Since our last Newsletter, our Session discussed:**

1. A Joint Session with both Deacons and Elders was held on Tuesday, December 15.
2. Discussions were held regarding reverting back to the original time for both Sunday School and Worship Services and when to lock the front doors. The Session approved as stated with Sunday School beginning at 10:00 am and Worship Service at 11:00 am beginning January 3rd.
3. Shepherding groups will be reassigned to accommodate the Elders/Deacons rotating on to fulfill slots of those rotating off.
4. A Special Musical Christmas will be held Sunday, December 20th during the 10:30 Worship Service. Christmas Eve Service will be held on December 24th at 5:30 PM.
5. Due to COVID, window replacements will not occur before January. There has been a water faucet installed outside of the building of the columbarium. Good's Gutters has been contracted to clean the Church, picnic shelter and manse gutters. The Hot Water Pump in the boiler room that provides hot water to the Fellowship Hall and Sanctuary has a leak and will be repaired at the end of the heating season.
6. David and Rachel Carter will be residing in Greensboro for several months until their next assignment. They will be headquartered out of Spain in order to have access to a better school system for their children.
7. The Nursery Worker position has been eliminated due to the fact that we do not have small children attending at this time. We are asking volunteers to fulfill this position if the need should arise.
