First Pres. Family,

As our country celebrates independence I am concerned about instances in our nation where human liberties are being suppressed. A case in point is the concern in Christian communities about the newest theory that is being taught in many schools called Critical Race Theory. Critical Race Theory is derived from a Marxist ideology that divides humanity into two categories: the oppressed and the oppressor. We have read stories of young people who appear to be white being forced by teachers and professors to confess their identity as oppressor, while those whose skin is darker to embrace the label oppressed. Students who challenge these labels risk ostracism and even discipline from the teachers and institutions.



As Christians we are sensitized to the sin of racism and desire to be on the "right" side of these discussions. However, the Christian worldview differs significantly from the Marxist. To a Christian there are indeed two categories of human beings, lost sinners and saved sinners. The Bible, does not designate humans according to race but insists that all people are made in the image of God and therefore are to be equally treated with dignity and respect. All life comes from God and is to be valued highly. However, in these discussions Christians are shouted down if they dare to say that "every life matters." Christians acknowledge that racism is a sin and seek to repent and dismantle any structures that oppress others, but we do not believe that the sins of our ancestors are to be visited upon us today.

In the face of these controversies there is a tendency for Christians to do one of two things: either embrace the Marxist ideology and abandon Christian beliefs and worldview, or to resist going with the crowd and cling to distinctly Christian beliefs while using the occasion to renew efforts to love our neighbor, oppose racism, and promote human life, equality, and dignity.


*"To the one who overcomes, I will give the right to sit with me on my throne, just as I overcame and sat down with my Father on his throne. He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches."* Revelation 3:21-22.

The quote above is the conclusion of Jesus' word to the Church at Laodicea. Jesus had harsh words for that Church: 3:16 *So, because you are lukewarm – neither hot nor cold – I am about to spit you out of my mouth.*" The book of Revelation is a vision that the Apostle John received from the risen Christ. It is a book of hope for oppressed people reminding them that regardless of how difficult their situation, Christ will return, set things right, and vindicate their faith. The book begins with three chapters of messages for seven churches. The messages were given for specific churches, but the messages are relevant for churches today. Christ admonishes His churches to root out any sin that interferes with their relationship with Him, while also encouraging them to faithfulness and hope in spite of challenges to their faith. Revelation emphasizes overcoming and sustaining faith from knowing that Christ is the victorious Lord who conquered sin and death and rules the universe in majesty and power. We do not want to be lukewarm in our devotion to Christ and the Christian worldview.

**Communion** - Our next observance of the Lord's Supper will be August 1st. Mark your calendars and make sure you come to church to observe this holy sacrament.







Then they heard a soft cry coming from their four-year-old son's bedroom. They rushed down the hall. There he was, lying on the floor next to his bed. The mother picked up the little boy and asked him what had happened.

He said, "I fell out of bed." She said, "Why did you fall out of bed?"

He shrugged and said, "I don't know. I guess I just didn't get far enough in."

Last month, I discussed being "All in". Along that line, we also need to make sure we're "far enough in". 
