"I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus." Philippians 3:14

Of all the Israelites, perhaps no one strove harder to please God than Saul of Tarsus.

Every area of his life conformed strictly to the Law. No one could accuse this respected Pharisee of lacking zeal. He was a man with a mission-a mission to please and serve God.

But on the road to Damascus, Saul's life changed entirely. From now on, he would no longer try to please God himself. Instead, he would press on with the goal of knowing Christ. "I consider everything a loss compared to the surpassing greatness of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord." Philippians 3:8 (NIV emphasis added). Missionary Update - Wycliffe Bible Translation in Cameroon with Matthew and Teresa

Thanks for the enduring faithfulness of God through our ministry partners. Teresa just received recognition for her 10 years serving with Wycliffe and Matthew for his 15 years. As young as we (sometimes) feel at 38, we're often counted among the elders here in Cameroon. We've rejoiced with you as God moves mightily and provides for His people and His mission every year in unexpected ways. We have seen the transformation that Bible translation, Ian-

guage development, and trauma healing have brought to countless lives. Matthew's role transitions more and more towards equipping others to train. With staff transition at the Greenhouse, Teresa will soon have the most seniority.

Highlights of the past few months:

Visitors in Cameroon - With all the weirdness of the 2020s, we have been in Africa full-time since January 2020 and we are not scheduled for home assignment until 2024-2025 school year. This means we had only seen our families online, until 2023.

In April, Matthew's parents, Russell and Marilyn, had the opportunity to come visit us in Cameroon for the first time for a couple of weeks. This was a precious blessing. Having Matthew's parents visit was not only a direct blessing to us but also a testament to the love and support we have received from our loved ones back home.

Traveling - In June, [we began] traveling westward. Flying out of Cameroon to spend a short time in Europe with Teresa's sister, then fly on to the USA for a few weeks to reconnect with families and celebrate our 10th wedding anniversary. After leaving the US, Matthew will head to Thailand to assist with a workshop on text parsing, grammar and morphology. As we thought about this trip, we realize Teresa will make it around the world in 57 days. Matthew's trip will be 70.

Truck - We have the opportunity to buy the truck we've been using for a great price, but this was not in the planned budget, so we have an unexpected expense of \$7,200. Any assistance would greatly help. Thank you for all your support throughout the years.

Freedom

As July approaches I always look forward to the celebrations on the 4th. I love the fireworks and celebrating this wonderful country and those who fought for our freedom. In thinking about this I found an interesting talk that discussed people who come to America, from other countries, learn the true meaning of 'freedom'. Others think of "freedom" as "free from", as in the absence of pain or malice or suppression. Whereas, God's definition of freedom is the "freedom to" - the freedom to

exercise our individual agency, knowing there are consequences for everything we say, think, and/or do. Christ wants to strengthen us and give us power as we make righteous choices. He has promised to protect those who worship Him and follow His commandments.

Conrad Hilton said "Man possesses human dignity because he is made in the image and likeness of God; ... Without this image, man has no free will and frequently neither liberty nor the capacity for liberty." Then later he said "In this struggle for freedom, at home and abroad, our greatest weapon, both a sword and a shield will be our love of and faith in God."

For centuries our ancestors fought, suffered, and sacrificed, that we might have this wonderful blessing of freedom. We owe it to them and generations to come to be willing to do the same. Unfortunately, many today are using their freedoms to restrict the freedom of others. Just as God helped the Israelites to prosper in the face of slavery to Egypt, He will support us and we too can prosper. As we unite as Christians in fervent prayer, and stand up for our right to worship, the Lord will see our faith and support the cause of truth and freedom.

John Adams said, "Our Constitution was made only for a moral and religious people. It is wholly inadequate to the government of any other." It is evident that the Lord "established the Constitution of this land, by the hands of wise men who [the Lord] raised up" for this very purpose."

This divine constitution requires more; it demands for the people to respect it, and work within its established conditions. Alexander Hamilton said, speaking of the Constitution, "I sincerely esteem it a system, which without the finger of God, never could have been suggested and agreed upon by such a diversity of interest." He recognized it was God that helped bring unity to the founders, it was a divine calling for each to be there.

America! America! May God thy gold refine,


