First Pres. Family,

Pastor John's first sermon with us was an inspiring message on "Growing God's Presence" at First Pres. He really made us think about how we at First Presbyterian can live out our mission statement within our church and community. This fall, we will have several opportunities and events to help us do just that! Here's a brief list of some of those upcoming activities from our "Mission Corner."

In a few weeks, we'll provide the congregation with information on supporting the Persecution Project with an emergency tarp initiative for the displaced people in the Nuba mountains of Sudan. Recently, we have received urgent updates from the project informing us that the situation has escalated in the region. The tarp initiative will give us a way to provide some assistance during this horrific crisis.

Pastor Glenn had mentioned that he'd seen an increase in the number of people stopping by the church seeking food assistance. I can still see him saying, "they were really hungry!" It's hard to imagine hunger in our community. While there are food pantries available locally, they are normally only open on specific days/hours. In the past, we've not had anything to offer those seeking assistance except to let them know when food banks are available.

To help with that need, we would like to have on hand a few ready- to- go bags of nonperishable foods to offer when someone shows up on our doorsteps hungry.

These bags might include snack type items, such as protein bars, dried fruit, nuts, peanut butter crackers, Gatorade, water for example. We would also include a list of local food and social service resources in the bags.

In October, we will discuss ways in which the congregation can help with this effort. World Food Day is October 16.

For many years the members of First Pres have participated in Samaritan's Purse's Operation Christmas Child. Many of you will remember providing shoe boxes filled with items for disadvantaged children. We will continue to participate and are currently looking at the possibility of becoming a collection center for this area. More info to follow!

We're discussing plans for having fellowship time between Sunday School and worship. This gives us another opportunity to grow God's Presence at First Pres!

We're excited about the opportunities ahead of us! Let us be the hands and feet of Jesus.

In this book there is the *Upper Story*. God is real, he is present, and he working on our behalf. Heaven is breaking into the world more than we recognize, and the story of God's seeking love, perpetual grace, and longing for relationship with ordinary people is breathtaking.

There is also the *Lower Story*. We live on earth. We make mistakes, run from God, and resist his overtures of love. Sometimes we get so mired in the Lower Story that we fail to recognize God's presence breaking into our world. We forget the God of Heaven longs to have a growing

On April 15, 2023, fighting erupted in Sudan between competing Islamist generals. This war has created a major humanitarian crisis in that country which is affecting tens of millions of people. The mainstream press is not reporting on this, making it hard to find much news coverage on this desperate situation.

Hundreds of thousands of families have already been displaced. As many as 250,000 ethnic Nubans have fled the cities to their ancestral mountain homeland in Southern Kordofan State (SKS), where the Nuba Mountains provide not safe haven, but at least safer than in the cities. SKS is home to the largest community of Christians in Sudan.

You may recall that a few years ago our congregation assisted in purchasing a tractor for the hospital in that region, so they could grow their own food. It is wonderful to know that the hospital is still thriving and providing medical care for the Nubans there. It serves as many as 3,000 patients per month.

PPF is engaged in assisting as many displaced Nuba Christians as possible.

One of the most urgent needs is heavy-duty emergency shelter tarps. These are used to cover the temporary grass huts constructed by refugees as they seek to rebuild their lives after losing everything.



Will you help us help PPF to shelter more families? A \$40 gift represents the cost to purchase and distribute a heavy-duty shelter tarp to one family. You are asked to prayerfully consider making a donation of \$40, or any increment of \$10, for purchasing these tarps for our Christian brothers and sisters in this region. This campaign will last until Sept. 17. Checks should be made out to First Presbyterian Church, with "Tarps" on the memo line. You can use a pew envelope marked "Tarps" and put it in the offering plate, or you can mail or bring your donation into the church office.

While the PNC will not disband until Pastor John achieves ordination, we will continue to support him as he prepares to take the ordination exams and meets the requirements set by the Presbytery's Commission on Ministry. John has been put in contact with the Committee on Preparation for the Ministry who will assist him as he navigates the path to ordination in the PC(USA). S.M.I.L.E

In studying Paul's writings recently for Sunday School, I came across an acronym that made an impression on me. S.M.I.L.E. = Spiritually Minded Is Life Eternal.

In his letters Paul is wanting to bring the various groups of Christians together and thinking of Christ. There were several conflicts as the newly formed Christian church had both gentile and Jewish Christians. The Jewish people had hundreds of years of following the Mosaic Law,

and many got so centered on the Law that they forgot who gave them the Law and why the Law was given: to bring them closer to Christ.

In Romans 8, Paul is correcting the Jewish people who are sure that Gentiles need to conform to the Mosaic laws, then move on from there. He lets the Jewish people know that the Lord loves all people. Romans 8:1, "There is ... no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus who walk not after the flesh but after the Spirit." Paul was teaching that all people who love the Lord and follow Him are loved and accepted. He later goes on to say in Romans 8:6: "For to be carnally minded is death, but to be spiritually minded is life and peace." Paul wanted the people to see that living by the Law wasn't the way to salvation. It is only through Jesus Christ that we can be saved from this wicked world.

Paul was teaching the saints to be in constant thought of Christ; to be open to hear the promptings of the Holy Ghost in all they do. Even in trials, they should be seeking after Christ, and the Spirit which He sent, would then be with them, to give comfort and guidance.

As we listen carefully and keep our thoughts on what Christ wants us to do, we can become more than we could on our own.

I am reminded of the wrist bands which were very popular some years ago; on the wrist band were the letters WWJD. If we have those thoughts primarily in our minds, and not worry about the worldly commotion, we can find much more peace and true happiness. Then as the acronym states we can SMILE and feel the love of God and the blessings of Christ's atonement on our behalf. In that way we can feel more secure in our daily activities and crisis.

As we literally SMILE, may we remember that to SMILE is the best way to live, and will help us feel closer to the Lord.
