The Beautifully Simple Gospel



I pray this season of Lent, the season of prayer, fasting, and spiritual renewal and growth, has been a blessing for you. As we study and learn, and attempt to grow in spiritual maturity, there are times we can get too complicated in our theology. I'll be the first one to admit it. I love to dive into a passage and dig out all the context clues with their cultural nuances and links to various other

passages in scripture, culminating is this wonderfully intricate Biblical principle that has weaved its way throughout salvation history. These studies are very useful, and indeed necessary, for breaking down a passage to write a sermon, commentary, or a book, but I started thinking about our mission as the Church; to go and make disciples. I wondered, "How is the message of the Church perceived, or received?" To answer this question, I need to only look back on my own journey. During my childhood and church youth group years, I cannot recall a pastor or preacher who proclaimed the Gospel message. I learned about the life of Jesus. I heard lessons on how to be a good person and how to live a good life. I even learned how to snow ski with the youth group, but I was never told about God's love and how His love saved us from our sins through Jesus Christ on the cross, and eternity with God because of the resurrection.

I say all this to get us thinking about Easter and what kind of message we are sending as a church. The seasons of Christmas and Easter give us unique opportunities where people are more receptive to Jesus. Here comes the scary part, "What do I say?!? I'm not a theologian or history scholar." Here is the cool part. You don't have to be! Most people we encounter already know who Jesus is, and the essential historical events. There is also a good chance they will know some of His miracles. What most people need is a simple Gospel message from someone who cares. And if they have questions that you can't answer, there is the awesome response of, "I don't know. Let's find out." Don't be scared of saying, "I don't know." What you do know is of much greater importance, and that is your testimony of how **God has forgiven you and made you into a new creation with the Holy Spirit dwelling within you.**

Feeling stuck and unsure how to proceed? Scripture is always a great place to go. Here are some basic Gospel fundamentals:

1 Cor. 15:3-5 "³ For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, ⁴ that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures," (NIV) This is a Creed Paul received from the apostles. Early creeds give short summary statements about what the early Church believed, like the Apostle's Creed we recite.

Romans 3:23-25a "²³ for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴ and all are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus. ²⁵ God presented Christ as a sacrifice of atonement, through the shedding of his blood—to be received by faith." We are saved <u>By Grace Through Faith!</u> We need salvation because our sins have separated us from God, and we cannot earn salvation. Grace is an undeserved gift, freely given because of God's love.

Romans 10:9-10 "9 If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰ For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved." There is no magical incantation needed to be saved. Simply believe in your heart and profess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and Savior. (Continued on page 2)



2 Cor. 5:18-19a "¹⁸ All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: ¹⁹ that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting people's sins against them." Salvation is not hell insurance or simply a bus ticket to heaven. It is not human centric of, "What do I get out of it." Salvation is God the Father repairing our relationship with Him and bringing His children home!

Here is the challenge. Think of at least 1 person you know who may need to hear this message of Grace, and share it by Easter! "¹³ I can do all this through him who gives me strength." (Phil. 4:13, NIV).

Bicycle Parable



I recently was reminded of a book I'd read some many years ago. It is titled "Believing Christ" by Stephen Robinson. The book was eye opening to me. I appreciate the teachings of the importance of the Atonement of Jesus Christ in my life.

One story that really struck me was called the Parable of the Bicycle. In that story the author talks about his little 7-year-

old daughter wanting a bicycle. He thinking that funds were low and wanting to pacify her, he says: "You save all your pennies, and pretty soon you'll have enough for a bike." With that she went away. A couple weeks later, he realized she was getting paid from mom for a job she had just completed. Then he heard "clink, clink." After asking what she was doing, his daughter came to him with a jar full of pennies and said, "You promised me that if I saved all my pennies, pretty soon I'd have enough for a bike. And, Daddy, I've saved every single one of them."

As parents I think we can all feel the pull on his heart. So, they went shopping for a bike. She found the one she wanted, and was very excited until she saw the price tag; she began to grimace. She realized she didn't have enough money to buy the bike. He asked how much she had, and she said, "Sixty-one cents." Without hesitation, he said, "if you give me everything you've got and a hug and a kiss, and the bike is yours."

He drew a message of the Atonement of Christ from this experience.

He realized we all want something, though not a bicycle, we do want to return to heaven to be with God and Jesus Christ. But no matter how hard we try, we come up short. We cannot save ourselves. But because of the Atonement of Jesus, He covers the price. What we have to give is meager in comparison to the actual cost, but if we give it all with love and devotion, He will take us and make us more than we could ever be without Him. He will deliver us and accept us into heaven, because we trusted and gave all we could to Him and His mission. Christ wants our whole heart. He wants us to trust Him with complete trust. Sometimes life throws us curveballs and we can find it hard to trust Him. But especially in those tough times, if we will humble ourselves, recognize any fault that may be ours, repent, and turn to Him with faith and trust, He will see us through.

C.S. Lewis said it like this: "Christ says 'Give me All. I don't want so much of your time and so much of your money and so much of your work: I want You."

Because of the Atonement, we have the assurance, just as Isaiah taught: "Come now, and let us reason together, saith the Lord: though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they be red like crimson, they shall be as wool." Isaiah 1:18 (KJV)


