



We had people vote for more than one—listing a preference of 1st, 2nd, or 3rd choice.


Additional thoughts:


Flexible, will go with other's thoughts

Blessing Bucket Event - A huge shout out to all who came to help. With over 120 volunteers from across the area. We met our goal of raising \$40K. We feel blessed to partner with First Baptist, Clarksville Presbyterian, SVHEC, as well as other organizations that had fund raisers and brought volunteers. We all came together as a large community with one heart and one mission, to help bring hope and the love of Christ to those devastated by natural disasters.





I have been thinking about the current darkness in the world. We know that Christ is the Light of the world. He is my light. In John 12:46 NKJV we read, "I have come as a light into the world, that whoever believes in Me should not abide in darkness."

Recently I heard an analogy that I really liked from an entomologist. Because of all his work with insects he sees gospel truths in insect behavior and characteristics.

He said, "Insects have an amazing capacity to detect and respond to light." We have all experienced the mass of insects flying around our

porch lights at night. This term he said is called Phototaxis. Some insects show positive phototaxis, while others have negative response. Moths are an example of those with positive phototaxis. They consistently fly toward light; they cannot resist the stimulus the light provides.

Cockroaches on the other hand have negative phototaxis. They run from light as quickly as they can. They prefer the darkness.

He asked the question, "When directed to follow Christ, how do we react? Do we go to Christ's light like a moth to a porch light, or do we go away from Him as a cockroach retreats from light?"

I am not sure why I was struck by this analogy, but it really hit me. Do I want to be a moth or a cockroach?

Christ has also said in John 8:12 NKJV "I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the light of life."

As we draw toward the Light, toward Christ, we are filled with His love and become more like Him. We then are filled with His light. Again, we are commanded, "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven." Matthew 5:16 NKJV.

My challenge to myself and to us all is to continue in faith, be anxiously drawn to the Light, be a moth, not a cockroach. Let's let our light shine! ~ **Sherolyn**










Women's Bible Study - Fall study will begin on Wednesday, September 10 at 10:30 am.
